Andrea Regoli graduated in statistics and economics at the University of Siena and then earned a Ph.D. in applied statistics at the University of Florence. He worked at Istat (National Statistical Institute) at the implementation of the Italian component of the European Community Household Panel (ECHP) Survey. He conducts research on income distribution, economic inequality and poverty. He also investigates issues in quality of life and sustainability, as well as equity and efficiency in education. He worked as a consultant for the International Labour Organization (ILO) for the Global Wage Report and for evaluating the working conditions of youth in the labour market. He has been a visiting professor at Warsaw University SGGW and at Vienna University of Economics and Business. He lectured at several International Summer Schools on poverty and social exclusion. He teaches doctoral courses on statistical modelling.
